## **Professional Development in AT&AEM**

The center develops and delivers multi-modal professional development opportunities and technical assistance, while collaborating with key partners to build local and regional capacity to assess and implement AT devices, services, and AEM for students with various disabilities.

#### **Resources for Print Disabilities**

The center sources AEM for local education agencies and renders a variety of alternative format types to meet the needs of students with print disabilities. It is Ohio's liaison to the National Instructional Materials Accessibility Center (NIMAC). The center administers the Braille Excellence for Students and Teachers (BEST) project, which is dedicated to braille literacy, instruction, materials, and technology in schools, while aiding education agencies in establishing braille production centers.

# Short- and Long-Term Loan Access to AT

The center selects, acquires, and manages an AT device loan program supporting needs, such as communication, writing, reading, math, vision, hearing, daily living and more – including training and support in the use of these technologies. The center conducts the Ohio Federal Quota program, supporting funding for AT and AEM for qualifying students.
